ii) The member organizations that have expressed interest in the proposed ICPC-3 Consortium may not be in a position to make the suggested financial contributions if called upon in the near future.

Given Wonca's current constraints and its very limited finances and resources, some pragmatic possibilities were suggested:

- i) Wonca may wish to consider exiting the 'ICPC business' and make a commercial decision to sell ICPC2 to IHTSDO for an agreed sum and to engage those experts that worked on ICPC2 to be consultants in the development of ICPC3.
- ii) Wonca could put the development of ICPC-3 out to tender, with Wonca obtaining a management fee at an agreed percentage. Potential buyers could be WHO, IHTSDO or a benefactor.
